Letter from Gerald Davies Ltd re renewal of maintenance contract for the year 2005/2006. G.D. Ltd had reconsidered their position relative to termination of the contract and would be prepared to continue for 2005/2006 if the issue of the damage to the cricket wicket could be resolved on the basis of the offer previously made of £180.00. The revised charge for the Maintenance Contract for 2005/2006 would be £9587.13 exclusive of VAT but inclusive of the £866.25 incurred due to variation associated with Mansel Green.

Detailed discussion ensued from disclosure of these charges and strong opinion was voiced over the apparent threat of current termination of the contract with the cricket season well advanced and the fottball season fast approaching making it extremely difficult potentially to obtain the services of a suitable replacement contractor.

It was decided finally to continue the Maintenance Contract on the terms outlined.

It was decided to set up a Working Party to review maintenance contract terms, clarifying what was to be done, when it was to be done with a view to going out to tender in the Spring of 2006.

The Council affirmed that once a decision had been arrived at by the Council, then it must be accepted by all members of the Council.

Dog signs in Nursery Park : this matter was raised and attention drawn to its long outstanding nature. It was agreed that the Clerk should contact R.Reed with a view to arranging fixture.

Contributions to the cost of the proposed War Memorial: The Clerk reported that an offer had been received from Mr G. Jones of £100.00 and a further contribution from P.Jones of £100.00 also.

The new Footpaths Officer agreed to explore the possibility of organising a perambulation of the Footpaths in the Community Council area by members of the Council with open invitation to members of the public to join them.

ACCOUNTS

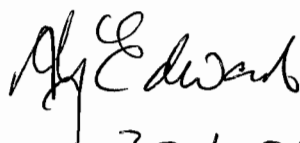
The accounts as detailed on the schedule submitted were approved for payment.
